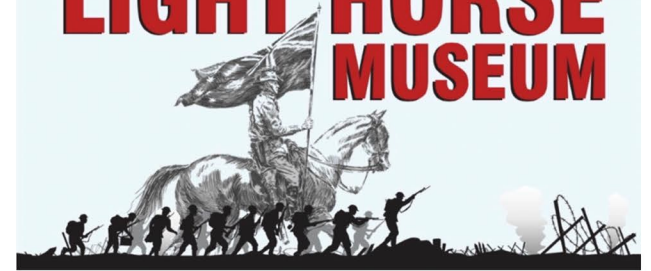
Excursion Program (Times may vary depending on group)

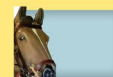
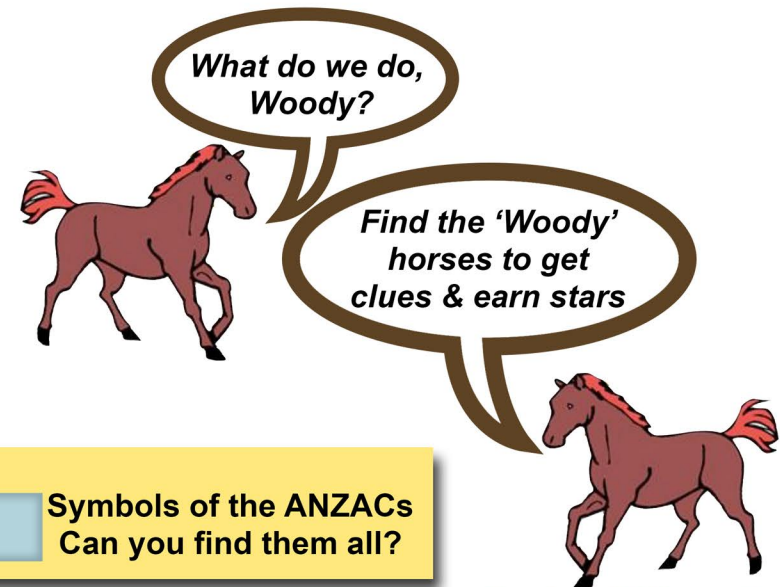

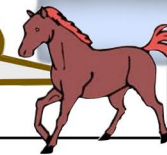

Symbol of the Diggers. Light Horse ones have emu plumes

Badge worn on the hat by diggers since WWI. See the circle of bayonets and crown.

Used to play 'Reveille' and the 'Last Post.' 'Reveille' starts the day - the 'Last Post' ends it.

Grew wild at Gallipoli. Symbol of remembrance. Helps students memory too - smell it!
